Motivation

Music is universal and found in all cultures. Alongside language, it distinguishes us from other species and it has the power to transform lives.

For most of us, music, in one form or another plays an important part in our lives, serving many different purposes from providing private solace and reflection to having important social functions.

Music is also important to our economy. There are a wide range of music related careers in addition to the obvious one of being a professional performer. More importantly for many, music enables the pursuit of interesting and rewarding social and leisure activities, increasingly so for older people as the lifespan continues to lengthen.

Singing or learning to play an instrument is the starting point for many who go on to participate in music, but many give up formal tuition only to wish they had continued later in life.

Some parents recognise this in themselves and provide support for their offspring through the difficult times when practice becomes a chore. The key is in motivation.

Motivation can be intrinsic, extrinsic or a combination of the two. In the early stages of playing an instrument, learners need to have encouraging and relatively uncritical support from their teachers, parents and peers. Praise is crucial to the development of self-confidence, particularly early on. If they decide to make an on-going commitment to music they will look to teachers to act as role models and to provide constructive feedback on how they can improve.

Simply participating is not enough. As human beings we like to learn and to improve.

Singing or learning to play an instrument is the starting point for many who go on to participate in music, but many give up formal tuition only to wish they had continued later in life.

There is no short-cut to improving skills other than practising. So how do we motivate and encourage young people to practice? Teachers are increasingly developing ways of teaching technique musically to enhance pupils' enjoyment and motivation - for example, teaching and playing scales with 'jazzy' rhythms, asking groups of students to play scales in thirds or contrary motion, getting students to compose their own studies which rehearse particular techniques. Repertoire can be carefully chosen to provide interesting, enjoyable and challenging tasks.

Making music with others is crucial. For young people the peer group is very powerful. The phenomenon that is El Sistema is challenging many assumptions by insisting on providing access to the ensemble from the earliest

stages of making music and providing for group practice and peer support. For El Sistema, frequent performance of inspirational music is also seen as a key ingredient for success. One of the strange things about music is that we can continue to enjoy performing simple 'favourite' pieces that we sing or play well.

Ultimately, motivation to continue with music must be intrinsic, but along the way others can help or hinder by the type of extrinsic motivation they provide. Whether music is for personal or social benefits, as a hobby or a profession, the right balance of challenge, support and enjoyment can lead to a richer and more fulfilling life.



What makes a great performance?

What are directors of music looking for when they audition potential music scholars?

What are ABRSM examiners looking for when they mark exams?

What are parents looking for when they hear their children perform?

In this brief article, I want to reflect on what it is that makes a performance special and reconsider how teachers and parents can support young musicians, especially when it comes to performance in potentially pressured contexts.

In any performance situation, the one thing that stands out is the musician who really enjoys their playing or singing; someone who brings a personal spark of enthusiasm to their interpretation.



Of course the nuts and bolts of a performance need to be well assembled, smooth and reliable, but the 'x-factor' is about the level of engagement between the performer, their instrument, their music and the audience. So, how do we nurture this spark?

In working with young musicians we need to promote a balance between obligation and spontaneity, between stress and enjoyment. If we over-egg the sense of obligation to play, and of the intense pressure to achieve, we can unwittingly create the stress which can undermine enjoyment. It's a very difficult and delicate balance to strike. but we need to find ways of encouraging and supporting developing performers which do not overload them in unhelpful ways.



This might mean restraining ourselves from being persistently critical, and instead commending what is going well and pointing out how much progress has been made. As a parent, it may mean the difference between standing over a young planist while they play, and listening through an open door from the next room - perhaps giving the occasional 'sounds good keep going', rather than saying 'that bar still doesn't sound quite right yet, does it?'.





The key here is encouragement and support that focuses on the positives.

For example, I've always thought that the term 'practice' has a lot to answer for in undermining good intentions: 'Go and do your piano practice first.' 'Have you practised your flute today?" 'How much practice have you managed this week?" If we try to reduce the gap between 'practising' and 'playing' an instrument, the idea and reality of regular, productive, practical activity could become more palatable, 'Do some piano playing first.' 'Have you played your flute today?" 'How much playing have you managed this week?' These gentle jogs and nudges can really help, and by thinking of 'playing' rather than 'practising', we can lift the psychological resistance which

can sometimes become associated with the notion of 'practice'.

Still in the realm of practice, I am aware that students often say 'It's not really worth me playing for just ten minutes' or 'It's not worth getting my instrument out if I'll have to put it away again so soon'. A helpful maxim here is 'It's never not worth it! If you add up all those 'not worth it' minutes over the weeks and months, they soon mount up. Much better to seize all those ten or fifteen minute slots, and make the most of them, rather than to tell ourselves it's not worth it! As teachers and parents, our role is to help developing

musicians to become independent learners who take responsibility for their own progress, and who play because they themselves want to. Obviously the transition is gradual, but it is worth keeping this goal in mind. Taking more of that responsibility ourselves may not be helpful in the longrun, and could undermine spontaneity, enjoyment and that vital, personal spark. Worth a thought!

What is the right school for my child?

There are many important considerations to make if you are choosing an independent senior school for your child.



For those with musical offspring, the considerations are complex - the 'fit' must be right not only for their child's general education and personal development but for their musical growth too. Talented musicians are often strong academically and, contrary to the common misperception, they often want to participate fully in sporting pursuits too, so these dimensions need to be factored in.

An advantage of having a musical child is the possibility of winning a scholarship to help reduce the financial burden of attending an independent school. However, in an increasingly competitive world, this cannot be taken for granted for even the most talented child. Should a scholarship be out of

reach, an exhibition award which provides for free instrumental/vocal coaching might be a possibility.

Schools generally look for quality and potential in a child alongside past achievement. In terms of music grade examinations, a low pass at grade 7 or above in a primary study may not necessarily be considered preferable to a distinction at a lower grade. Music staff at top schools will place great emphasis on performance at an on-site audition and will evaluate musicianship, technique and the overall profile of a child to ensure they will be suited to the ethos and culture of the institution. The ability, interest and willingness to contribute to the musical life of a school.

participate in communal activities and mix with other students is key. Another aspect to consider is the choice of a second instrument which can greatly increase a prospective pupil's desirability to a school – especially if it is a 'minority' instrument such as oboe, bassoon, horn or viola.

Orchestral, ensemble and choral experience will enhance a child's chances of being selected by your chosen school.

Whilst impossible to foresee how a young person's abilities, skills and interests will have developed two to three years ahead, this is when parents have to start thinking about school options. Parents can access a wealth of information including this publication. A combination of web-research,

studying prospectuses from your favoured five or six schools and a discussion with the director of music and headteacher at your child's current school will reap dividends. Most headteachers will be able to advise on prospective schools whilst directors of music may have strong links with their music departments, perhaps knowing pupils who have studied there. Some music directors may be willing to make an informal approach to schools on your behalf. (Note that this is not in their Job Description though!)

The MTA's membership comes from a wide range of schools across the sectors and its conferences and other meetings provide ideal opportunities for music teachers from all school sectors to meet their peers. exchange ideas and discuss their departments. So, do find out if the head of music at your current school is a member of the MTA. Feedback from parents who have sent their children to a school can give you some insight too - but treat it with detachment as every child will have a different experience.

Returning to the key issue of balance between music and other activities, there can be tensions between the performing arts, sports and academic subjects. Usually (but not always!) there is a 'give and take approach' to ensure that the same children do not miss orchestra every week because of football, hockey or netball and peripatetic lessons should be rotated to avoid missing the same subject lesson regularly.

Whilst impossible to foresee how a young person's abilities, skills and interests will have developed two to three years ahead, this is when parents have to start thinking about school options.

The merit of boarding versus non-residential is a fundamental issue and you must choose the right option for your child. The logistical challenges for parents of managing their own professional and personal lives with a school will be a determining factor as will be the proximity of the school. Many parents and children cannot bear the thought of being separated for a week/weeks on end and some children just aren't ready to move from home at this age whilst others relish it from the outset or adapt quickly to really enjoy it. Boarding opens up more opportunities because of the time available but is more expensive. Day pupils can find packing everything into a shorter timeframe quite exhausting and can be too tired to do useful music practice when they get home especially when they have a second instrument. There will still be plenty of weekend/holiday courses, both residential and non-residential, for them though if you do opt for a day-school.

All schools should offer the chance to visit the music department, meet its staff and see the facilities and many will invite your child for a 'preaudition' (up to a year in advance). This enables dialogue with the Director of Music about

whether your child is, or might be, at the right musical standard and whether a scholarship is a possibility. Do enquire about the school's peripatetic staff who will usually be first rate.

So, there's plenty to think about but hopefully, having weighed up the various issues, you will have a sense of what might be the right school for your child. My final piece of advice is to talk with your son or daughter about all of this and ensure they feel involved at every step. Your choice should be governed by what is absolutely right for them as an individual rather than your preference of a 'trophy' school for CV value. Good luck!

Tips for singing and improvisation

Q&A with Alexander L'Estrange



1. What is the most important thing to remember when preparing to sing?

The most important thing about singing to an audience, for example at an audition or in a concert, is one of the most obvious things: remember that as a singer you have a secret advantage over instrumentalists, the WORDS. You are not just trying to make a beautiful noise and communicate the musical

message, but also the meaning, atmosphere, story and sound-world of the text. So a good tip: if you, the singer, pay attention to "hearing" every word you sing (i.e. not just the notes), the listener will also, with no effort at all, "get" the text and hence stand a greater chance of being moved, amused, engaged or

entertained, as appropriate. At the same time, of course, they will also be better able to appreciate and judge the musical aspects of your performances.

2. What tips can you give for warming up your vocal chords?

Every singer and singing teacher has their own preferences - a choral scholar friend of mine at Oxford used to claim his daily warm-up routine before Evensong consisted merely of "brushing his teeth"! - but I have found that warming up the different parts of one's range, taking care to match the tone, vocal strength and vowel sounds

across the registers, is extremely useful. Also, before an audition or performance I would spend time thinking about communication - speaking the words of the song like an actor would, and then singing them to an imagined audience, considering your posture and physicality, your eye-line and your facial expression. Also,

how and when does the song end? - is there a piano "outro", and if so, what are you, the singer, doing or communicating during that time? Or, is there a "golden silence" at the end, and if so, for how long? - where will your focus be during it?

3. What is your most memorable performance and why?

As a boy I was a chorister in New College Choir, Oxford. and I can still recall the excitement and the drama of performing Bach's "St John Passion*, with a Baroque orchestra - particularly the "crowd" scenes, singing (although it felt more as if the crowd were shouting) "Kreuzige ihn!", or "Crucify him!". I can still remember swathes of the treble part, in German, to this day, such an impact did the piece make on me. More recently, as a composer, it is probably performances of my own

works that stick in my mind, for example hundreds of Primary School children singing and dancing to the African and gospel grooves of Zimbe! with a cathedral choir, school choir or choral society and my jazz quintet: to see singers aged 7 to 70 together, sharing and communicating the same simple, exciting melodies and rhythms continues to be one of the greatest musical pleasures for me. Every Christmas we have dozens of performances of my folk-imbued Wassail! Carols of Comfort & Joy while the latest large-scale work,



Freedom! The Power of Song (written with my wife Joanna Forbes L'Estrange) celebrates Martin Luther King, the Suffragettes and other recent events in history when singing has helped to change the world for the better. I love seeing the excitement in the children's eyes when they hear the jazz band for the first time!

4. Is learning about jazz and improvisation important for a music student?

Just as students learn about recognising and differentiating between musical styles (for example, a string player not playing Vivaldi and Rachmaninoff in the same way) I believe jazz and "lighter" styles of music are equally valid and useful for their (and our) musical education. So, for a Wind or Big Band playing a jazz arrangement, or a choral singer tackling a piece of close harmony, it is essential they learn about and experience different rhythmic "feels", especially swing (not rushing, leaning on 2 & 4 and "doo-BAdoo-BA" swung - "tripletised" quavers). Choirs and singers also need to have a chance to

experiment with pronouncing consonants and diphthongs in a more natural, speech-like way so as not to sound "square" - listen to the way top vocal groups like the King's Singers, Voces 8 and The Swingles pronounce words, diphthongs and all, "as one", as if one person were speaking them. To ignore these stylistic points would be as inappropriate as ladling on the heavy Romantic vibrato in a Baroque trio sonata.

As for learning and developing improvisation, I believe that an authentic *rhythmic* framework (i.e. setting up and maintaining a correct feel or groove) is the best way in here, trading call-

and-response rhythmic patterns with a teacher or leader. Even for instrumentalists in a band. this can work really well vocally, to start with - try using scat syllables with "doo" for on-beat quavers and "ba" for off-beat ones (on a unison note if you like). Clicking on 2 and 4 (never 1 & 3!) is a sine gua non here. Then, moving these rhythmic patterns onto an instrument should follow naturally (aiming to imitate the vocal phrasing); the notechoices can be expanded to a pentatonic scale - try C-D-Eb-G-A over a 12-bar blues in C, for example.

Dealing with nerves in auditions

A few years ago I found myself back at Bedford School, where I'd been a music scholar growing up. I was at the school for the Music Teachers' Association Conference, and I was tabled to be speaking to the conference about music making in the community. Looking out across the sea of faces, I realised that I, 25 years young at the time, was stood with a hundred or so heads of music from the top independent schools in the country watching me carefully.

As I took a deep breath, put my notes to one side and launched into my speech, I realised that my nerves were on edge far more in this situation than when I walk out on to stage to give a performance with VOCES8, the group that takes up all my time as an a cappella performer. In front of those Directors of Music, I felt my nerves more strongly than I normally would, but when preparing for a performance of any form, whether it's a presentation, a

musical performance, a sports match or an exam, there are common feelings that we have to deal with, and common ways in which we can learn to control our emotions.

I had a flashback to the audition I'd been through twelve years earlier in the same building with just one Director of Music present. My voice was changing at the time. I'd been a treble in the choir at Westminster Abbey, but over the previous few months, my voice had begun its steady descent downwards, and by the time of my audition for a music scholarship, my voice wouldn't respond as I wanted it to.

My audition piece was a tricky solo from the 'Sanctus' by Francis Grier, and I remember vividly the frustration I felt as I tried to sing to the Director of Music. Various notes simply didn't come out any more. I wanted to cry, it was so infuriating, I knew that this was an important day, and my voice just wouldn't do what I told it to. Despite leaving feeling that I'd completely failed, I was offered a full music scholarship to the school.

And here's one key point. A Director of Music should, and will, be looking for musical intelligence, potential, passion and enthusiasm. Directors of Music are experts in their field, and will see what a potential scholar can achieve whilst at the school. While your child will obviously hope to be at their best when they audition, nothing is more important than that they try to relax and be themselves.

Even today, as I leave the stage night after night picking apart the moments in the performance that should have gone better, I try to remember that we are always are own worst critic. As a teenager with a changing voice, I should have realised that giving a perfect vocal performance wouldn't necessarily happen, but at the time, that thought didn't even cross my mind. When talking to students thinking about applying for scholarships at any level, I ask them to think about who they are and what they want. Often, we perform at our best when we're in surroundings that suit us. Choosing a school where you feel 'at home' is of vital

importance. You may only realise which school triggers this feeling after an audition.

Looking for a place where you can embrace and experiment with plenty of different forms and styles of music making is important for a child's overall musical education. I wouldn't advise anyone to specialise in one particular area of music until they've gained as broad an understanding as possible through these important and formative school years.

Finding a school where music has an integral part in school life is, for me, also of huge importance. I work with many schools across the UK, and can honestly say that schools which give music a central role have a greater sense of community and happier, more open minded (and often more successful!) students.

Thinking about those nerves on the day, what advice would I give to help with preparation? There are, of course, many answers to this question, but here are three simple ideas:



Warm up your whole body:

Stretching and waking up all of your muscles will give you better control of your physical actions – whether singing or playing. Pay particular attention to areas of your body that you know get affected when you're nervous. I get tense hands and shoulders!

Take your time:

Our awareness of time can heighten dramatically during performance. Don't worry about taking a few seconds to compose yourself. Breathe deeply and focus on the task in hand. A moment of silence can feel like a lifetime to you, but no one else will notice.

Smile:

When you arrive and prepare for the audition, if you are smiling, it's likely that the person auditioning you will smile back, and that will make you more comfortable.

continued:

Thinking about the right school, and the right scholarship, for your son or daughter is never easy. There are so many wonderful schools around the country that will offer you everything that you could want. I had a fantastic time as a music scholar at Bedford School, and I have many friends working with me as professional musicians and educators who had equally fantastic experiences at other schools in the UK. Having worked in leading schools across Europe, the USA, in Asia and in

Africa, I can honestly say that, as a general rule, the music making in independent schools in the UK is at the very forefront of music education. Good luck making your choice. I hope your children are lucky enough to enjoy the same level of wonderful experiences that I did as I grew up.

The Scholarship Process John Padley

The application and process of taking a music scholarship can seem quite daunting but most senior schools are happy to offer help and guidance to reassure parents and candidates. Often, schools encourage parents to contact the senior school Director of Music before applying to arrange to meet prospective candidates. This is to be encouraged and really helps to outline the process and to answer any queries about the audition itself.

The choice of senior schools is something which should be carefully considered and discussed with the junior school's Head and Head of Music. Parents should then contact the Admissions department or Registrar of the senior school, who will be happy to provide further information. Many schools offer music and academic scholarships at 11+, 13+ and 6th form entry.

The Registrar or Admissions Team will often be able to arrange an informal meeting with the Director of Music which is a good way of making contact and finding out more. It should be stressed that there is no question of this meeting leading to any 'fixing' of an award. The earlier this meeting can take place, the better and it is fine for this to happen in Year 5 with a subsequent follow-up in Year 6.

The purpose of this meeting is to demystify the

scholarship process, provide guidance and information of what is required in the audition and to put the candidate at their ease so that they can perform well. It is so much easier for the candidate to perform if they have met the people that are listening to them and to get a good feel for the surroundings and place where they are performing. The Director of Music may also give advice on areas that the candidate should work on.

This is also a good moment for parents and candidates to ask any questions about the musical life of the school and the role and expectations of a scholar. A 'scholarship' implies a deeper understanding of learning and commitment to that learning. This is especially the case for musicians and the expectation is that they are committed to continuing their musical development and being involved in the

ensembles and activities of a busy music department. The senior school music department and Director of Music also has a responsibility to support this learning and monitor the development of the music scholar both in academic and pastoral areas.

With this preparation, when the scholarship audition day comes along, it is to be hoped that the candidate will feel more confident and certain about what to expect and more relaxed with performing.

Recommended Code of Practice for Music Awards at 13+

The Music Teachers' Association recommended Code of Practice provides an administrative framework for the admission of candidates being considered for music awards at 13+.



It ensures an orderly and transparent process for the offering of places to the candidates, in line with their expressed preferences, and enables more pupils to attend the school which they feel best suits them.

- Relevant details from the Code of Practice:
- Schools who have signed up to the code would usually hold their Music Scholarship trials in the fifth week of January each year.
- For parents wishing to apply to more than one school, they should place them in order of preference. Once the application has been submitted they may not be altered. This order must be identical on the application form for each school and include all schools to which parents are applying, even if an individual school has not signed-up to the code.
- For the system to run effectively any bursary applications should be made in advance of music award applications, so that parents have all the facts at their disposal when deciding on an order of preference.
- Applications forms must be signed by the Head and Director of Music of the present school. The present school (not the parent) will then send copies of the application forms (together with a confidential reference) to each school at which a music scholarship is being sought.

- No school will make offers or intimations of awards before the trials
- Results of the audition are announced promptly following the trials by the school of first choice.
- When applications are made to more than one school, the second choice school should wait to hear from the first choice school whether or not an offer is being made. If it is, the second choice school must not make an offer. If the first choice school is not going to make an offer then the second choice school is able to make an offer if they wish. An identical procedure follows for the school of third choice.
- Awards accepted verbally must be confirmed in writing (or email) and must be taken up in the following academic year.
- No award may be confirmed until all the requirements of Common Entrance/other entrance requirements have been met.






